PennDOT Clinton County Maintenance Work Schedule for the Week of May 20

Clearfield, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced the following schedule of maintenance activities in Clinton County the week of May 20. PennDOT performs year-round maintenance in its mission to provide a safe, efficient transportation system, and the scope of work in Clinton County for the coming week is as follows:

Base Repair:

- Route 477 between the intersection of Route 2008 (Auction Road) in Lamar Township and the Centre/Clinton County line in Greene Township, Monday, May 20, through Friday, May 24. Flaggers in the roadway will provide traffic control during daylight hours.

Base repair is intended to repair fatigue cracked, potholed or distorted pavement sections and restore the structural integrity of the pavement. All distressed material within the area, including the material beneath the asphalt, is removed and replaced with sound material. The new material is then compacted before being overlaid with new asphalt. Base repair extends the service life of good and fair roads and provides a smooth, safe ride for motorists.

Bridge Maintenance & Cleaning

- Route 220 between the Mill Hall/Flemington interchange in Mill Hall Borough and the Avis interchange in Pine Creek Township. Monday, May 20, through Friday, May 24. PennDOT will implement short-term lane closures while completing this work. PennDOT will implement short-term lane closures while completing this work.
- Interstate 80 between mile marker 170 and the Jersey Shore interchange. Monday, May 20, through Friday, May 24. This work takes place off the roadway and has minimal, if any, traffic impact.

Pennsylvania has some of the oldest bridges in the country, with an age of more than 50 years on average. Preventive maintenance is vital in extending the life of the structures. As such, PennDOT maintenance crews perform some bridge deck patching and structural repairs.

Manual Patching

- Route 1006 (Cemetery Street) in Dunnstable and Pine Creek Township. Monday, May 20, through Friday, May 24. Flaggers in the roadway will provide traffic control during daylight hours.

- Route 664 (Coudersport Pike) between Route 44 and Hazard Road. Wednesday, May 22, through Friday, May 24. Flaggers in the roadway will provide traffic control during daylight hours.

Shoulder Maintenance

- Route 664 (Coudersport Pike) between Route 44 and Hazard Road. Wednesday, May 22, through Friday, May 24. Flaggers in the roadway will provide traffic control during daylight hours.

Shoulder cutting removes excess material and debris from unpaved shoulder areas. Shoulder grading involves the shaping and stabilizing of those same areas. Both operations improve drainage, allow water to leave the roadway, and eliminate shoulder drop-offs. These are crucial highway maintenance operations because when drainage systems do not function properly, water collects on the road, weakens pavement, accelerates the formation of potholes, and creates the potential for icing conditions in the winter months.

This schedule is subject to change due to weather conditions, emergencies, or other unforeseen interruptions.
