

JORDAN ROAD BRIDGE OVER INTERSTATE 90 PROJECT, ERIE COUNTY

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project is to replace the Jordan Road (Route 4108) bridge over Interstate 90 in Harborcreek Township, Erie County

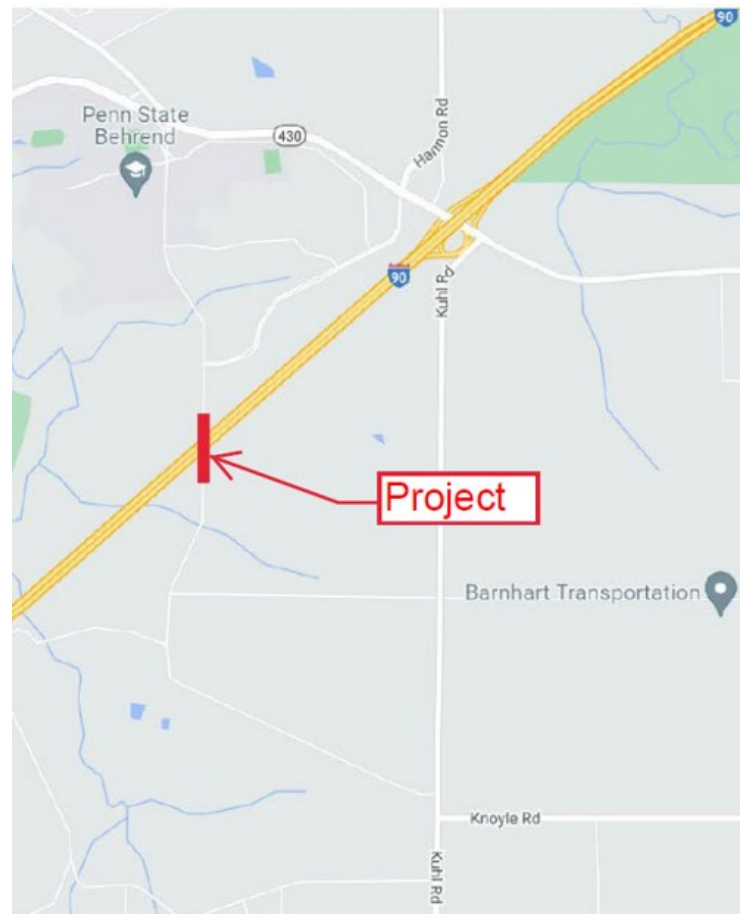
Work will include raising the vertical profile of the Jordan Road bridge to meet current bridge height requirements over interstates. It will also include guiderail and drainage updates.

On average, approximately 800 vehicles per day use Jordan Road, and approximately 20,000 vehicles per day use Interstate 90 in the project area. The bridge is rated in poor condition.

Work is expected to occur in approximately six months during the 2025 construction season.

PROJECT AREA

The bridge is located on Jordan Road just south of the Penn State Behrend college campus.



TRAFFIC IMPACTS

A detour will be required during construction and is expected to be in place for approximately four months, likely during the summer to fall months. The proposed 3-mile detour route will be posted using Knowledge Parkway, Station Road (SR 290), Kuhl Road, and Harborgreene Road.

CONSTRUCTION FUNDING

An estimated construction cost for the project is approximately \$4,000,000, and the project will be funded entirely with federal funding.

This project is funded at least in part by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL).

CURRENT PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The purpose of the public comment period is to introduce the project and receive input regarding any questions or concerns with the project. It is also an opportunity for the public to review and comment on the project's potential effect upon Cultural Resources pursuant to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's 36 CFR Part 800 regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. The project documents can be made available in alternative languages or formats if requested.
