







## PennDOT announced last month that the application round for the **2023 Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TASA)** is open to project sponsors with approximately \$28 million in statewide funds available. The TASA provides funding for transportation alternatives, including on- and off-road pedestrian and bicycle

public transportation and enhanced mobility; community improvement activities and environmental mitigation; and trails. Eligible project sponsors include local, county and tribal governments, transit agencies, schools, school districts, nonprofits and small Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). Additional projects eligible may include bicycle and pedestrian facilities, conversion of abandoned railway corridors to trails,



Sponsors may submit draft applications through July 17, 2023, for District review. If approved to move on in the process, all applications may be submitted until September 15, 2023. Selections from participating large MPOs will be due December 1, 2023. The statewide project selection committee will meet in January 2024 to recommend projects for the funds.


